



Ira Reynolds' ledger and diary, 1848-1869

From the Collection

This ledger kept by Ira Reynolds provides insight into the daily lives of Canton residents in the mid-19th century. The beginning is a diary kept by Reynolds where he documents the events around town and nationally, including the weather, town meetings, and the results of the presidential election. Later, the ledger turns into a cash book documenting financial transactions with people around town.

Ira was a farmer who lived on what is now the River Road, not far from the town line with Peru. He was born in 1807, when Canton was still part of the town of Jay, and was the grandson of Peter Austin, an early settler of Canton. His wife, Nancy, was a member of the Coolidge family. He eventually moved to Dixfield to live with his daughter, dying there in 1898 at the age of 91.
