From the Collection

Recently a Canton resident donated a 1922 plan of the Herdsdale Farm. The blueprint (shown below) shows the various lots that made up the farm. The farm was located on what is now River Road, which can be seen on the map between Lot 21 and Lot 22. The road at the bottom of the plan is Pleasant Street heading to Peru. The intersection of Pleasant Street and River Road looks a bit different now as this was before the construction of the new road, Route 108. The Herdsdale Farm was operated by Warren Ward in the 1800s. Ward had come to Canton from New York City and was married to Mary Elizabeth Austin who was born and raised in Canton. This plan adds another great resource to telling the story of Canton's past.
