

From the Collection

Recently a Canton resident donated a clock that had been in her home for many years. The clock originally came from the Baptist Church where it had been donated in memory of Caleb Mendall, a Civil War soldier who died during the war. The exact details are not known, but it is assuming it was donated by his brother, Gilson, who lived in Canton and is buried in Pine Grove Cemetery. The Mendalls were originally from Hartford but lived not far from the town line on Staples Hill. This beautiful clock fits in nicely in the museum!
